MANDATE

Handicap International is continuing its efforts to help people who are vulnerable to natural and human disasters in Pakistan. Our work currently focuses on natural disaster risk management and meeting the needs of people displaced as a result of natural catastrophes.

SITUATION

Pakistan is increasingly and regularly hit by natural disasters. In 2005, an earthquake killed more than 70,000 people and displaced 3 million others from their homes. In 2010, unprecedented flooding affected more than 20 million people. Similar disasters occur every year, although on a smaller scale. In 2014, nearly 3,500 villages were destroyed, affecting some 2 million people.

INITIAL ACTIONS

Handicap International launched its first actions in Pakistan in the early 1980s and continued working with Afghan refugees until the end of the 1990s. Following a series of natural disasters, the organisation returned to Pakistan, particularly in response to the humanitarian emergency caused by flooding that hit the country in 2010.

Increasing community resilience to natural disasters by reducing their vulnerability to risk.

GOAL

The project aims at contributing to an increase in community resilience to natural hazard by enabling communities to identify and address critical issues (such as destroyed infrastructures, increased poverty, etc.) causing or contributing to their vulnerability to disaster risks. The project particularly focuses on the vulnerabilities of persons with disabilities.

METHOD

Handicap International is aiming to address the vulnerabilities of the communities through a community based disaster risk management. The project will:

- Mobilise communities to assess and evaluate risks through participatory identification and implementation of an inclusive Community Based Disaster Risk Management model.
- Link stakeholders at all levels to provide individuals and communities with greater means to address vulnerabilities to disasters.
- Implement community based solutions to address the root causes of vulnerability to disasters. For example, the community will be involved in defining criteria to increase food security, or designing a community strategy to sustain livelihoods.
